# Homo legens in the digital world: hopes and anxieties Andrii Dakhnii

Doctor of Philosophy, Head of the Department of History of Philosophy, Ivan Franko National University of Lviv

This talk based on my book 'Burning the books: A History of knowledge under attack (2020) will examine how libraries and archives have been the subject of deliberate attacks in order to control knowledge for over 3000 years, It will also show how librarians and archivists have sought to defend knowledge and protect society. It will also examine five key functions of libraries and archives, and how these institutions form part of the infrastructure of democracy and of freedom itself.

**Richard Ovenden** has been Bodley's Librarian (the senior Executive position of the Bodleian Libraries, University of Oxford) since 2014, and Head of Gardens, Libraries and Museums, since 2022. Prior to this he has held positions at Durham University Library, the House of Lords Library, the National Library of Scotland, and the University of Edinburgh. He was educated at the University of Durham and University College London, and holds a Professorial Fellowship at Balliol College, Oxford, and was awarded the OBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours 2019.

Richard serves as President of the Digital Preservation Coalition, and holds Fellowships of the Royal Historical Society, the Society of Antiquaries and the Royal Society of Edinburgh, and has been elected to the American Philosophical Society and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He was made an Horary Doctor of Letters by Durham University in 2024. He writes extensively on libraries, archives and information management, and has published a monograph on the 19th century Scottish photographer John Thomson, co-edited the massive 17th century library catalogue of Samuel Jeake, co-edited a volume of essays honouring the writer and editor Christopher Tolkien, and most recently is the author of Burning the Books: A

History of Knowledge under Attack (2020) which was BBC Radio 4's Book of the Week, and was shortlisted for the Wolfson History Prize in 2021. He writes regularly for the Financial Times.

The full-scale Russian war in Ukraine acquired a civilizational dimension and raised issues related to history, historical memory, and national identity. Political myth-making, informational attacks on the history of Ukraine and its researchers, cultural genocide and attempts to destroy Ukrainian identity became the background of hostilities on the front line, Russian aggressors' strikes on energy infrastructure, children's hospitals and maternity homes. During the meeting, we will talk about the informational dimension of the war, cultural diplomacy, protection of Ukrainian values, narratives and identity in the context of historical memory, literary heritage and library activities.
